





Cutting

20977- W (A): Cut 4 - 10½" x 10½" squares 20980 - T (B): Cut 16 - 5½" x 5½" squares

Cut 6 – 21/2" x width of fabric strips for binding (reserve remainder for backing)

21025 - T (C): Cut 6 - 23/4" x 51/2" strips 21026 - S (D): Cut 6 - 23/4" x 51/2" strips

20978 - K (E): Cut 2 - 51/2" x 5 1/2" squares

20979 - TW (F): Cut 8 - 41/2" x 101/2" strips

Panel (20976 - R):

- 1. Fussy cut 2 of the rectangle designs out, leaving a ¼ inch seam allowance around design. Finished size should be 10½" x 15½" rectangle.
- 2. Fussy Cut 4 21/2" x 101/2" strips from red border of panel taking care that the squares are in the middle of the strip.
- 3. Fussy cut 2 $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares from remaining rectangle designs on the panel, having in total 4 $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Sashing and inner border (20982 - E): Stripe orientation is important – read carefully before cutting! Refer to quilt image. The amount of fabric stated will cover the sashings and the inner border with piecing.

Stripes are vertical in sashing rows. Trim the selvage first, and then cut as below.

Cut: 5 - 21/2" x width of fabric strips- sub cut each strip to 351/2 inches.

Refold fabric to have the stripes going the other way when you cut. Then cut as stated below. You may want to fussy cut so the stripes match up when pieced together. NOTE: 2 strips are for top and bottom inner border

Cut: 4 - 2½" x length of fabric strips. Sew 2 strips together and subcut to 2½" x 48½". Make 2 (side inner border) sub cut remaining 2 strips to 2½" x 35½" each.

Outer border (20980 -T):

Cut: 6 - 5½" x width of fabric strips. Sew 4 strips together. Sub cut 2 - 5½" x 58½" strips (side outer border), sub cut remaining 2 strips to 5½" x 39½" each.

BLOCK ASSEMBLY

Square in a Square Blocks

Place one Fabric B 5½ square face down in upper left corner of a Fabric A 10½" square. Sew along the diagonal, careful not to stretch fabric, trim seam allowance to ¼" and then press to corner.





Place 2nd 5½" square on upper right corner. Sew along diagonal, trim seam allowance to ¼" and then press to corner. Repeat on the subsequent corners. Press. Make 4 Square in a Square Blocks.

Block A

Sew Fabric C and Fabric D 23/4" x 51/2" rectangles together. Make 6 - 51/2" x 51/2" squares, Unit A. Press.




Unit A

Sew a Unit A to 5½" squares cut from Fabric E. Refer to quilt image for correct fabric orientation for Unit A. Make 3 – Unit B. Sew a Unit A to 5½" squares cut from panel. Refer to quilt image for correct fabric orientation for Unit A. Make 3 – Unit C.



Unit B Unit C

Assemble Units B and Units C as below to create 2, 101/2" x 151/2" blocks - Block A.



Block B

Sew a Fabric F 2½" x 10½ strip to either side of a red 2½" x 10½" strips cut from panel to create a10½" x 10½" block - Block B. Make 4.


Assembling Rows

Sew a Square in a Square block to both sides of Block A. Press seams toward Block A. Repeat with remaining Square in a Square Blocks and Block A. Row 1 and 3 complete.


Sew a Block B to both sides of a fussy cut 10½"x15½" panel. Press seams toward fussy cut panel. Repeat with remaining Block B and fussy cut 10½" x 15½". Row 2 and 4 complete.

Assembling Quilt Top

Sew rows and sashing strips in order as shown in Figure 1 below. Next sew on top and bottom inner border, then side inner borders. Sew outer border in same manner. Layer, guilt and bind.
