

Cutting Directions:

21087-F Fussy cut 12 – Santa face shapes. Cut a 12" x 12" square of freezer paper. To create the octagon snowball shape from the square make 2- 4 %" freezer paper squares and cut once diagonally. Iron a triangle to each corner of the large freezer paper square, trim off the triangles leaving a ¼ inch seam allowance of double freezer paper. This step will give you more area to cut your Santas. You will need to cut every other Santa in each row, alternating between rows. For example, in the first row cut Santas 1 and 3, in the next cut Santas 2 and 4 and so on. Be sure to include all 8 Santas, 4 will be repeats.

- 21089-R Cut 9 5" strips for Border #2.
- 21091-F Cut 9 21/2" strips for Border #1.
- 21091-R Cut 3 18½" squares, cut in half twice diagonally to create 12 inset triangles. Ten of the triangles will be used. Cut 2 9¾ " squares, cut in half diagonally to create 4 corner triangles.
- 21092-G Fussy cut 16 2½" strips, centering the "tiles" within the width of each strip. Cut each strip into 3 12½" rectangles yielding 48 2½" x 12½" sashing strips.
- 21093-S Cut 1 41/2" strip. Cut 9 2" strips for the binding.
- 21094-F Cut 2 41/2" strips for the 9-patch blocks.
- 21094-R Cut 3 41/2" strips for the 9-patch blocks. Cut 9 11/2" strips for Border #3.
- 21095-B Cut 3 4%" strips. Cut into 24 4%" squares. Cut squares diagonally once into 48 half-square triangles for the corners of the Santa Face blocks.

21095-R Cut 4 - 4" x 4" squares for side edge cornerstones. Cut in half diagonally twice yielding 16 triangles, use 14. Cut 2 - 2½" strips for sashing cornerstones. Cut 17 - 2½" squares.

Sewing directions

The center of the quilt top is put together in diagonal rows, working from the top right to the bottom left.

Santa Face Blocks - 12 blocks

1. Sew a 21095B triangle to the center of each side of the Santa Face square. Trim to a 121/2" square.

9-Patch Blocks - 6 blocks

1. Sew one strip of red 21094R between 2 strips of green 21094F to make a strata of green, red, green. Press seams toward center. Repeat to make a total of 2 RGR strata (Fig.1)

- 2. Sew one strip of yellow 21093S between 2 strips of red 21094R to make a strata of red, yellow, red. (Fig. 2) Press seams away from center.
- 3. Slice strata into 41/2" sections, yielding 12 GRG and 6 RYR.

4. Lay out 9-patch blocks. (Fig. 3)

Sew 9-patches together to form a 12½" block (Fig.4)

Sashing

1. Sew sashing strip sets together, beginning with top right sashing strip set; triangle cornerstone, sashing strip, triangle cornerstone. Sew the second sashing strip in this order: triangle cornerstone, sashing strip, square cornerstone, sashing strip, square cornerstone, sashing strip, triangle cornerstone. Continue sewing sashing strip sets together, increasing by 2 sashing strips each time until there are 6 sashing strips in a set, then decreasing by 2 sashing strips until you reach the bottom left strip set: triangle cornerstone, sashing strip, triangle cornerstone.

Putting it all together:

- 1. Sew a sashing strip to the top left and the bottom right of each Santa Face block.
- Layout Santa Face blocks, 9-patch blocks, side inset and corner triangles, and sashing strip sets on a design wall. Be careful to distribute Santa Face blocks to insure variety.
- Sew diagonal rows of edge triangles, blocks and sashing strips, working from the top right to the bottom left.
 - Add corner inset triangles to all four corners.

Borders

- 1. Piece Border strips together to make long strips.
- 2. Sew border strips #1, #2, and #3 together in a strata.
- Lay the border strata strip out over the quilt center to check for fit. Border strips should be approximately these lengths: Top and Bottom = 98", Sides = 78".
 - 4. Fit borders to quilt center and stitch, leaving 1/4" unstitched at corners, miter corners.

Binding

1. Sew binding strips together with mitered joins, press in half lengthwise.
