

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BEE YOURSELF TABLERUNNER

CUTTING

22482 B

• Cut (4) blocks 7" x 7". From the yellow border strips, cut (2) pieces 13¹/₂" x 4¹/₄".

22483 H

• Fussy cut (4) $2\frac{3}{4}$ squares. Use remainder for backing.

22483 O

• Cut (2) pieces 18 ¹/₂" x 2" and (2) pieces 63 ¹/₂" x 2". (The longer pieces may need to be pieced for the length.)

22484 J

- Cut (2) blocks 5³/₈" square.
- Cut diagonally for (4) half square triangles (HSTs).
- Cut (2) pieces 63 ¹/₂" x 1 ¹/₂" (piecing may be necessary for this length).

22485 J

- Cut (2) pieces 13 1/2" x 2 1/4".
- Cut (4) pieces 9¹/₂" x 2¹/₄".
- Cut (7) 5¹/₄" squares. Subcut diagonally in both directions for (4) quarter square triangles (**QST**s = 26 total **QST**s; 2 will be discarded). See Figure 1.

22487 O

- Cut (8) pieces 9¹/₂" x 1³/₄".
- Cut (8) pieces 7 x 1³/₄".
- Cut (1) 5³/₄" square. Subcut diagonally in both directions for (4) **QST**s.

22487 P

- Cut (6) 5¹/₄" squares. Subcut diagonally in both directions for (24) **QST**s.
- Cut (2) 2⁷/₈" squares and subcut diagonally for (4) **HST**s.

22486 PV

• Cut (5) 2" wide strips for binding.

CONSTRUCTION

Note: Sew with ¹/₄" seam allowance and fabrics right sides together. Press each seam as you sew, pressing toward the darker fabric.

1. Sew Bee blocks: Sew a 7" orange piece to each side edge of the Bee block and sew the $9\frac{1}{2}$ " orange pieces to the top and bottom edges (Figure 2). Make (4) blocks.

2. Sew center block: sew (2) green $2\frac{3}{4}$ square bee blocks together. Make (2) rows. Sew the (2) rows together. Sew an orange **QST** to each side edge. Sew an orange **QST** to the top and bottom edges (Figure 3).

3. Sew a floral **HST** to two opposite orange edges. Sew a floral **HST** to the remaining two orange edges (Figure 4).

4. Sew a pink QST to a black QST (Figure 5). Make 24.

5. Sew (12) of the black/pink units together. Make (2) rows. Sew a pink **HST** to the left edge. Sew a black **QST** to the right edge and sew a pink **HST** to end the row (Figure 6). Make (2) rows.

6. Sew the (5) blocks together, joining with a $9\frac{1}{2}$ black piece (Figure 7).

7. Sew a pink and black **QST** row to the top and bottom edges (Figure 8).

8. Sew a $13\frac{1}{2}''$ black strip to each side edge. Sew a $13\frac{1}{2}''$ border strip to each side edge. Sew a $63\frac{1}{2}''$ floral strip to the top and bottom edges (Figure 9).

9. Sew a $63 \frac{1}{2}''$ orange bee piece to the top and bottom edges. Sew an $18 \frac{1}{2}''$ orange bee piece to each side edge (Figure 10).

10. Layer and quilt as desired.

BEE YOURSELF PLACEMAT

Finished Size (Set of Two): 19¹/₂" x 14³/₄" Designed By: Phyllis Dobbs

CUTTING

22482 B

- Cut (4) blocks 7" x 7" (2 blocks for each placemat).
- Cut (2) pieces 17¹/₂" x 4¹/₄" from the yellow border strips.

22483 O

• Cut for backing.

22485 J

• Cut (4) pieces $15\frac{1}{4}$ x $1\frac{3}{4}$ and (4) pieces $17\frac{1}{2}$ x $1\frac{3}{4}$.

22486 PV

• Cut (4) 2" strips for binding.

22487 P

• Cut (8) pieces 9" x 1 ¹/₂" and (8) pieces 7" x 1 ¹/₂".

CONSTRUCTION

Note: Sew with ¹/₄" seam allowance and fabrics right sides together. Press each seam as you sew, pressing toward the darker fabric.

1. Sew blocks: Sew 7" x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " pink rectangle to top and bottom of Bee block. Sew 9" x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " pink rectangle to sides of Bee block (Figure 1). Repeat to make (4) blocks.

2. Sew (2) blocks together. Sew the yellow border piece to the bottom edge (Figure 2). Make (2).

3. Sew a $17\frac{1}{2}''$ black piece to the top and bottom edges. Sew a $15\frac{1}{4}''$ black piece to each side edge (Figure 3).

4. Layer and quilt as desired

BEE YOURSELF TOTE BAG

CUTTING

22482 B

• Cut (2) Bee Blocks 7" x 7".

22483 O

• Cut (1) piece 6" x 39". (This contains a little more length than needed. Trim after sewing.)

22484 J

- Cut (2) pieces 11 ¹/₄" x 16 ¹/₂".
- Cut (1) piece 6" x 39". (This contains a little more length than needed. Trim after sewing.)

22485 J

- Cut (2) pieces 11 ¹/₄" x 16 ¹/₂".
- Cut (2) pieces 7" x 7" for lining of Bee Block pockets.

22487 S

• Cut (2) pieces 3" x 28".

Batting

- Cut (2) pieces 11 ¹/₄" x 16 ¹/₂".
- Cut (1) piece 6" x 39". Cut (2) pieces 1" x 28".

CONSTRUCTION

Note: Sew with ¹/₄" seam allowance unless specified otherwise. Sew right sides together. Press seams as you sew.

1. Pin a green 7" square black pocket lining piece to a 7" square Bee Block, RST. Sew together leaving a 2" opening on the bottom edge. Turn right side out, press, and hand stitch the opening closed. Make (2).





2. Center the (2) pockets on one black piece. Pin and sew around the sides and bottom edges of the pocket, leaving the top edge open (Figure 1).



Figure 1 3. Pin each of the (2) black pieces and the 6" x 39" orange piece to the batting pieces of the same size, with the fabric right side up. Sew the pieces to the batting with a quilting stitch in your choice of quilting pattern or using free motion quilting. Do not stitch on the pockets.

4. Pin the long 6" wide orange strip to the side and bottom edges of the piece with the pockets, RST. At the bottom corners, clip in the seam area of the side panel for ease in turning. Repeat to sew the remaining black piece to the other long edge. Trim end if any excess fabric remains.

5. Repeat #4 above to sew the lining with the floral pieces. Lining is not quilted.

6. Lay a 1" wide batting strip centered on back side of one yellow 3" wide piece. Wrap the side edges of the fabric over the batting and fold under a hem on the top fabric. You may have to adjust the fabric so that the folded hem is next to a side edge. Pin and sew around the strap $\frac{1}{8}$ " from the side edges. Repeat to make (2) straps.

7. Lay the bag unit flat, right side out. Align the ends of one strap to one top edge about 8" apart and pin. Repeat with the other strap, pinning to the top edge of the other side of the bag. Baste straps in place (Figure 2)




8. With the floral lining turned wrong side out and the bag turned right side out, place the bag inside the floral lining. Align top edges and pin. Sew top edges with a $\frac{1}{2}''$ seam allowance, leaving a 4" opening between the straps on the back side. Turn right side out and press seam flat. Top stitch around the top edge $\frac{1}{4}''$ from the edge.
