


## Joyful Village A Folk Art Quilt

Joyful Village. A Folk Art Quilt Cut 3 strips, 2 1/2" x WOF. Piece together, then cut sewn strip to 2 - 50 1/2" strips. Size: 60" x 76" 1/2 Yard for binding; cut into 2" x WOF strips and Quilt Designed by Susan Guzman sew together, end-to-end. Skill Level: Beginner #20673 R (Fabric I - Red Blender) -Cut 2 strips, 4 1/8" x WOF. Then cut 18 – 4 Ouilt 1/8+\* squares Block Size: 11" x 11" #20674 H (Fabric J - Animals on Lime) -Cut 2 strips, 4 1/8" x WOF. Then cut 18 - 4 1/8+\* Be sure to read through the instructions squares completely before attempting this pattern. #20666 B (Fabric K - Panel) - 1 Panel Pattern uses 1/4" sewn seams for accuracy, Outside of the blue border on the panel, cut 1/4" unless stated otherwise seam allowance around entire double-image panel. #20667 B (Fabric L - Colorful Pictures) - Cut in CUTTING: half and sew together along selvage for backing WOF = Width of Fabric (Typically 42") HST = Half-Square Triangles SEWING: \* = add 1/16" more to the 4 1/8+ measurements 1. Assemble (4) 11 1/2" x 11 1/2" Pinwheel Blocks: with Fabric #20673 R & #20674 H Take your 2 stacks of 16 HST's in fabric #20673 G, and fabric #20672 BG. With right sides #20668 RS (Fabric A – People Stripe) – Fussy-cut together, pair up one HST from each color. Pin  $11-4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares along diagonal and sew seam; press with iron. #20669 L (Fabric B – Blue Pinstripe) – Fussy- cut You'll end with 16 blocks. Separate into 4 sets of 12 - 4 1/2" squares 4. Take your first set and sew together into a #20669 S (Fabric C - Yellow Pinstripe) - Fussypinwheel block. Trim up block to measure 11 1/2" cut 11 - 4 1/2" squares x 11 1/2". Do the same with the remaining 3 sets, #20670 O (Fabric D - Doorway Squares) -Fussythen sew the blocks together into a row; set aside. cut  $13 - 4 \frac{1}{2}$  squares #20671 Y (Fabric E – Blue Floating Huts) –Cut 2 2. Assemble (4) 11 1/2" x 11 1/2" Nine-Patch strips,  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF. Then cut  $12 - 4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Blocks: #20672 BG (Fabric F – Blue/Green Fish) –Cut 2 Very Important: Use a scant 1/4" seam allowance strips,  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF. Then cut  $8-6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares; to construct these blocks, only. cut on diagonal for 16 HST's. #20673 BG (Fabric G - Blue/Green Blender) - Cut Take your two stacks of  $18 - 4 \frac{1}{8} + \text{squares of}$ 3 strips, 1 1/2" x WOF. Piece together, then cut fabric #20673 R and #20674 H. Construct 2 of sewn strip to  $2-60 \frac{1}{2}$  strips. each - Nine-Patch blocks, as follows: Cut 3 strips, 1 1/2" x WOF. Piece together, then Block 1 – Make 2 cut sewn strip to  $2-46\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Row 1: Sew #20674 H, (to) #20673 R, (to) Cut 4 strips, 1 1/2" x WOF. Piece together, then #20674 H (Sew to a completed Row 2) cut sewn strip to  $2-60 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Row 2: Sew #20673 R, (to) #20674 H, (to) Cut 3 Strips, 1 1/2" x WOF. Piece together, then #20673 R (Sew to a completed Row 3) cut sewn strip to 2 - 52 1/2" strips. Row 3: Sew #20674 H, (to) #20673 R, (to) Cut 1 strip,  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF. Then cut  $5-4\frac{1}{2}$ " #20674 H squares Block 2 – Make 2 #20673 G (Fabric H – Green Blender) –Cut 2 Row 1: Sew #20673 R, (to) #20674 H, (to) strips,  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF. Then cut  $8-6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares; #20673 R (Sew to a completed Row 2) cut on diagonal for 16 HST's. Row 2: Sew #20674 H, (to) #20673 R, (to) Cut 4 strips, 2 1/2" x WOF. Piece together, then #20674 H (Sew to a completed Row 3) cut sewn strip to 2 - 62 1/2" strips.

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Row 3: Sew #20673 R, (to) #20674 H, (to) #20673

Now sew together blocks in this order: Block 1, Block 2, Block 1, and Block 2; set aside.

## 3. Assemble Center of Quilt:

Pin and sew top of panel to your row of pinwheel blocks; press seam with iron. Hint: You can use the line of the ¼" seam of the panel as a guide to sew your pieces together.

Pin and sew bottom of panel to your row of Nine-Patch blocks; press seam with iron.

## 4. Construct Borders:

Border 1: Fabric #20673 BG – Take two pieces measuring 1 ½" x 60 ½", pin and sew each to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Next, take two pieces measuring 1 ½" x 46 ½" and sew to each horizontal side of the quilt center.

Border 2: Fabric #20673 G – Take two pieces measuring 2 ½" x 62 ½", pin and sew each to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Next, take

two pieces measuring 2 ½" x 50 ½", pin and sew to each horizontal side of the quilt center.

Border 3: Fabric #20673 BG – Take two pieces measuring 1 ½" x 66 ½", pin and sew each to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Next, take two pieces measuring 1 ½" x 52 ½" and sew to each horizontal side of the quilt center.

Border 4: Take all remaining 4 ½" fabric squares; mix them up for a scrappy border. Piece together 17 squares for your right vertical border and 17 squares for your left vertical border; press seams with iron, then pin the length to quilt top and sew together, pressing seams with iron when finished. Next, piece together 15 squares for your top horizontal border and 15 squares for your bottom horizontal border; press seams with iron, then pin the length to quilt top and sew together, pressing seams with iron when finished.

Sandwich the quilt top with batting and #20667 B backing. Quilt the top, adding #20673 G as your pieced binding.
